

## INTRODUCTION

This art exhibit has 30 pieces by seventeen different artists. There are four different categories: drawings, paintings, prints and painted glass. They come from a variety of collectors in Windsor.

Collecting reflects value recognition. What is iconostasis in churches to believers, is different forms of visual art in the home of art lover. In other words what religious art is to the faithful, urban art, i.e., secular art, is for the individuals oriented to perceive truth through artist's discoveries about man and world, his/her gift to perceive, represent, express and state universal aspect of Truth, using his/her original visual language.

Collecting such art reflects our strive to look at an everchanging world of man and nature, their movements, transition, mutations, as well as man's dreams, desires, aspirations, humour or tragedy and so on; it also reflects a strive to understand this world. At many points it embodies a need to see and have a presence of beauty beside nature or man. Sometimes an aesthetic denial, present in the contemporary art, does not stop a collector to depict a piece of such kind, since the nature of collectors is acceptance of the meaningfullness of art context.

Collecting also has its commercial side. It becomes a profitable investment in art and it may confer prestige and status.
